Queen Lili'uokalani (Lee-lee-oo-oh-kuh-lah-nee)

- Queen of Hawai'i. She ruled through Jesus' teachings.
- Non-violent response to American invasion of Hawai'i in 1893.
- Appealed to the conscience of the U.S. and to the Christians. Even as she lost the struggle, she held to her non-violent convictions.
- Beloved by the Hawaiian native people.

William Wilberforce

- Used his position in British parliament to lobby for decades against slavery. Finally won the day.
- Had a wonderful encounter with the living God. His faith was contagious.
- Life as a politician was very difficult. Instead of seeking comfort, he endured in national politics until his vision became reality.

Cesar Chavez

- He struggled for the oppressed Latino migrant farm workers. American born Latino.
- His Catholic faith shaped his non-violent tactics and gave him hope in darkness.
- He knew that Jesus was radical like he was, and he daily tried to live the Gospels.

Pandita Ramabai

- Struggled for the young oppressed widows in India. "She laid the foundation for the women's liberation in India."
- She had a life-changing experience of Jesus. She translated the Bible into her native language- Marathi. Helped women read the Bible for themselves.

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
